Foundation phase: Grade R to Grade 3

In the foundation phase, we focus on teaching the foundational skills, concepts and knowledge which are required for further learning. We offer a vibrant, invitational atmosphere where the learners enjoy coming to school and where they acquire a love for learning that will sustain them throughout their school years. We acknowledge the potential in each learner to reach optimum ability; therefore, there is less emphasis on competitiveness and more emphasis on individual achievement. We create opportunities for personal growth in independence and responsibility so that learners can take up the challenge of being personally responsible and accountable for their actions in the intermediate phase.

Subjects

The three main learning areas are:
Language – English home language and Afrikaans first additional language.

Mathematics – Mathematical concepts, number concepts and practical application.

Life Skills – Learning skills which focus on personal, social and physical development and the promotion of good health.

Also:

An intensive reading programme is followed, and continuous assessment in all subjects is conducted. We encourage participation in cultural and sports activities. We embrace 21st century learning and incorporate technology with computer literacy.



Cultural activities could include:

Art, music, foundation phase choir and eisteddfod



Sports activities could include:

Soccer, netball, cricket and athletics

Intermediate phase: Grades 4 to 5 (Grades 6 and 7 to be phased in)

In the intermediate phase, the emphasis is still on establishing basic foundations, but learners are led into more abstract thought and independent work. Application of skills and concepts is also a focus area. This phase aims to prepare learners for the senior phase in high school.

STEP 2:

Complete the following documentation:

- Application-for-admission form
- Consent for credit check
- Debit-order instruction form
- General indemnity form

It is important to complete the application-for-admission form thoroughly and to attach ALL the certified supporting documents.



STEP 3:

Application forms will be assessed.

STEP 4:

Once the learner has been accepted, relevant details will be captured, at which time parents receive an email confirming the learner's status of acceptance and a family code, and the account holder receives an invoice for the once-off, non-refundable enrolment fee and the banking details.



STEP 5:

Payment of the enrolment fee must be made to secure the learner's place for the next academic year. (Please retain the proof of payment for record purposes.)
