
At Curro Delft, our goal is to develop responsible, independent and proud individuals who will make a positive contribution to society.

Curro Delft's unique DigiEd approach incorporates a deep-integrated project-based learning approach focusing on Mathematics, Science, and Technology.

Teaching takes place through digital learning tools and videos, while teachers and tutors provide one-on-one assistance in the classroom as needed. Learners set their own pace within a framework, which prevents any learner from falling behind or having to wait for others.

Learners are prepared for the National Senior Certificate (NSC) examination at the end of Grade 12.
